John Mark deserted Barnabas and Paul on their first missionary journey. (Acts 13:13 NIV)

  - a. What did you learn about yourself?

  - d. What risk are you taking for the Lord right now?
- 3. One of the powerful ministries available in the Church today is to encourage those who have fallen short and restore them to usefulness, like Paul did with John Mark.
  - a. Have you personally experienced this restoration?
  - b. Have you lifted someone from failure to usefulness?
  - c. Name someone you have dismissed as not being dependable. What restorative action might you take?
