

God's Way or Ours? Malachi 4:1-6 TLB Thoughts to Ponder

- 1. Long before the birth of Jesus, the prophet Malachi confronted God's people: "The day of judgment is coming." (Malachi 4:1 TLB)
 - a. They acted like God's people one day each week, but the rest of the week their lives revealed only a surface relationship with God. Is that how others see you?
 - b. They knew the ways and words of God, but they doubted God's judgment. Could that be said of you?
- 2. To prepare for the coming of the Lord, we must first accept the truth that we will be judged.
 - a. Many folks see God as being "kind, tolerant, benevolent and a regular nice guy sort of like a personal valet." Is that how you view God? If not, explain your view.
 - b. Do you see God's coming judgment as a negative happening? If so, why?
- 3. The second step in preparing for the coming of the Lord is to confess our sins.
 - a. "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves." (I John 1:8 ESV) Are you being honest about the gap between God's expectations of you and the reality of who you are?
 - b. What unconfessed sins are weighing you down?

- 4. The final step in preparing for the coming of the Lord is to repent, to radically change our ways so as to conform to God's ways.
 - a. Jesus said, "So be prepared, for you don't know what day your Lord is coming." (Matthew 24:42 TLB) How would you change your life if you knew Jesus was coming next Thursday?
 - b. You don't know He isn't, so why are you delaying the change?
