

"Waiting for the Messiah" – December 2022 Thoughts to Ponder

- 1. The Hebrews waited many centuries for the coming of the Messiah.
 - a. What's the longest wait you've endured? For what were you waiting?
 - b. While in a season of waiting, Dr. Phillip Brooks said, "I'm in a hurry, but God is not!" Would you have said the same thing?
 - c. In retrospect, how did God work on you during that season of unmet expectations?
- 2. Upon hearing that the Messiah had come and their waiting was over, the Hebrew religious leaders did not respond . . .
 - a. ... perhaps because they overestimated the importance of their work.
 - 1. Recall a time when your work took precedence over other facets of your life. What negative costs did you pay?
 - 2. Can others see by the commitments and sacrifices you're making that the Messiah has come into your life?

- b. ... perhaps because they overestimated their own significance.
 - 1. Recall a time when a prideful, self-centered attitude caused you to be indifferent to the input of others. What negative costs did you pay?
 - 2. Can others see by a reduced sense of personal significance that the Messiah's humility is reflected in your life?
- c. . . . perhaps because they underestimated the changes afoot.
 - 1. Recall a time when a preference for the status quo kept you from considering a new way of thinking and doing. What negative costs did you pay?
 - 2. The coming of the Messiah always changes things. Has Jesus come into your life? If so, what changes have you noticed? If not, what is keeping you from responding?
