

"Hide and Seek" - January 2024

Thoughts to Ponder

This sermon is based on the life of Moses; though much of it may be familiar to you, reading Exodus 1:8 - 2:10 and 3:1-6 will be helpful in grasping the context for my thoughts and their application in your life.

- 1. Moses was born into a family of Hebrew slaves in Egypt.
 - a. If the circumstances of your birth created hardships that shaped your early years, what were they and what lingering impact did they have?
 - b. Would you consider your childhood experiences to be typical of the day? If so, why? If not, why was your childhood atypical?
- 2. When he was approximately forty years of age, Moses had what might be termed "a mid-life crisis" that changed the projected course of his life.
 - a. If you had a similar experience, please share in as much detail as you feel comfortable.
 - b. In retrospect, please share what you now realize to be the pluses and minuses of that dramatic occurrence.

- 3. At various times, Moses appeared to be a Hebrew, an Egyptian and a Midianite . . . a slave, a prince and a shepherd.
 - a. Have you ever appeared to be something that you were not? If so, please explain the what and the why of your various disguises.
 - b. What prompted you to change disguises and how did people respond to the apparent change?
- 4. Many Christians are hiding their true identities so they can blend in with our increasingly pagan society.
 - a. How does that statement apply to you?
 - b. What are your primary motivations for living in hiding?
- 5. "Hide and Seek" is a child's game.
 - a. "Hide and Seek" is a game in which losing is really winning . . . what does that statement mean to you?
 - b. Are you an adult playing this child's game thinking you're winning when you're really losing? Please share your reasoning.
 - c. Jesus went about doing good; many Christians are content to just go about . . . are you one of them?
