

"If the LORD is God . . . Part I" Thoughts to Ponder

- 1. The false gods of this world will always fail us they can neither sustain us nor satisfy us.
 - a. Anything we put our trust in other than the Lord God Almighty is a false god . . . honestly: to what do look for your ultimate security (i.e. your portfolio, your good looks, your resume, your marriage)?
 - b. Many believe that happiness is a function of how much they have. Do you have any storage units? If so, why? If so, how would your life change if you gave all that stuff away?
 - c. Do you possess your possessions or do your possessions possess you?

Please read the text for this sermon: I Kings 18:16-40.

- 2. Elijah's repairing the altar on Mt. Carmel symbolizes the need we have to repair our relationships with God.
 - a. Describe your relationship with God and explain your evaluation?
 - b. The hardest person to see is yourself and the hardest thing to admit is that the face in your mirror is the face of a sinner . . . reconsider your response to 2a in light of this truth.

- 3. Elijah's offering a "worthy sacrifice" symbolizes our need to repent from following this world's false gods by giving the Lord first place in our lives.
 - a. Does how you serve the Lord with your time, talent and treasure show that He is truly the Lord of your life?
 - b. The rich young man Jesus encountered in Matthew 19:16-22 had it made in the world's eyes, yet he was miserable. Could that have been you at some point in your life? Explain. Is that still you? Explain.
- 4. When the lightning flashed and the sacrifice was consumed on Mt. Carmel, the people of Israel cried: "The LORD, he is God; the LORD, he is God!" In a sermon on this text, Peter Marshall declared from his pulpit: "If God be God, then serve Him. If Baal be god, then serve him and go to hell." Share your thoughts on Dr. Marshall's statement.
