One of the foundational principles of Biblical truth is called the Law of Reciprocity: "You reap what you sow." The idea is that people receive in proportion to what they give or do. For Christians, the principle of reciprocity began when we exchanged our sinfulness for Jesus' righteousness. This principle is universal and far-reaching, touching every relationship and condition of humanity, whether spiritual or physical. This law appears throughout Scripture both positively and negatively.

People may receive the same thing they give, such as mercy. Matthew 5:7

People may receive what they need from God in exchange for making his kingdom their top priority. Matthew 6:33

People may receive a larger harvest if they sow more seed. 2 Corinthians 9:6

People may receive from others in proportion to their generosity. Luke 6:38

Jesus tells people to do to others what they would have them do to them, which should be the measure of all actions. Matthew 7:12

Read Luke 6:37-38, Galatians 6:7-10
