 - a. Describe the differences you see in this country now and when you were a child and when your parents were children.
 - b. Describe how the way your children are being raised differs from the way your parents and grandparents were raised ... and the way you were raised.
- 2. "Children obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right." (Ephesians 6:1)
 - a. Before children can obey, parents must set limits. Describe the limits you set for your children and their response to those limits.
 - b. It has been said that, when it comes to raising their children, there are just three rules for parents: love, limit and let them be. Please explain why do you agree or disagree.
