## Financial Minutes Vestry Meeting January 2024

We continue to be amazed with the generosity and blessings we continue to receive. Our plate income for December was \$523,481.93 (vs. a budget of \$354,104.47) Our total Revenue income for December was \$622,193.97 vs a budget of \$427,604.47.

Our total expenses in December were \$778,266 vs a budget of \$264,229.65. The 2023 Fiscal year ended with the Parish is very good financial status, with all the restricted. accounts in good standing.

These total November income and expenses includes the Faith Formation income, Mission Outreach Income and Donations, Cross School Scholarships, Counseling Center, Diocesan Pledge and Diocesan Blessings.

Below is the request to approve the December funds that the Mission Board recommends for disbursement.

The Mission Board has on hand at the end of December \$278,029.86. They have already commitments for January (funds which they allocate monthly) \$20,583. The Mission Board has done their diligence and research through applications, and is requesting Grant Allocations for January for \$17,343 for a total distribution of \$37,926.

Keep in mind, any request from any Mission, needs to first have an application filed, then reviewed by the Mission Board, who discuss, pray and vote for a decision.

The financial Board reviewed the request, filed and approved a motion to recommend to the Vestry to APPROVE the request for funding.

Linda Laird presented and reviewed the request for funds to the Vestry. There was a motion to approve the funds disbursement, it was seconded and approved unanimously by the Vestry.

Restricted accounts remain in healthy standing and our cash position remains very strong

The meeting was called to order by Fr. Owens at 12:30PM in the Conference Room of the Chapel.

## I PRAYER AND DEVOTION: Linda Laird

Prayer opened the meeting and the devotion focused on "Calling Out to God." Linda introduced the book of Habakkuk to address the Question "Why does God let bad things happen?" Habakkuk calls out to God and ask him why he does not save them. Linda shared examples of how her family had reacted to events that called them to ask God "WHY." God responds to Habakkuk by telling him to look at the nations and watch and be utterly amazed. He also told Habakkuk to write down the revelations and make it plain to all. ## II HIGHLIGHTS OF CROSS SCHOOLS SENIORS MISSION TRIP: Pastor Nathan

Pastor Nathan provided each member of the Vestry with a copy of his daily journal from the mission trip to Costa Rica. The fifteen students were a little shy at first but were joyful and excited to be with the children. They were hosted by the SCORE International Missions. Leslie Albert prepared a wonderful program for the children. Our students were actors, performers, painters, encouragers, and deliverers of food. They accomplished a lot in a short time. One student asked to be baptized and Nathan made it happen. That moment will never be forgotten. Everyone thanked Nathan for his outstanding work with the Faith Formation at Cross School. He hopes to take every senior class on a mission trip.

## III: MINUTES: Joanne Byrd

The Vestry Minutes for February 23,2024 were electronically distributed and were approved as written.

IV FINANCE: Lee Watkins, Financial Overview for February 2024—March 15, 2024 Monthly Income was at \$324,832 to a budget of \$280,385—24% over expectations. Plate

Income for February was \$260,682.01 to a budget of \$212,260. Year to date (First two months) Plate Income stands at \$587,416.66 to a YTD Budget of \$437,785 for a positive variance of \$149,631.86 (Two months in, generous parishioners bless us!) Total Revenue for the year is \$710,780.86 to a budget of \$574,035.00. Additional income comes from grants, bequests, faith formation and the counseling center income. Total expenses for the month were at an actual of \$294,169.04 to a monthly budget of \$327,883.19. For a variance in our favor of \$33,714.15. YTD Expenses are at \$551,954.53 to a YTD budget of \$643,361.67. For a total under-budget variance of 91,416.14. Revenue continues to pace ahead of expectations while our expenses are below budget for these first two months of 2024. We are in a season of abundance but not complacency! Looking ahead to March—we are in a month with 5 Sundays, the last one being Easter. We should expect higher revenue. Plate Income for the first two Sundays in March stands at \$100,990.00. Lee explained that the Sweep accounts under CSB IntraFi ended February at 1,652,075.20, earned interest of \$3314.02 and were moved over to the Argent account. Streaming: The COTC Website continues to attract visitors with over 4400 page views. Returning viewers made up over five hundred of these, which shows two things; first, people are returning for information, and, secondly, our parishioners are utilizing the website for church news and information. Remember that not all people watching sermons come through TCOTC web page, some will view them on YouTube as well.

## Attendance Review:

YTD 2024 In Person attendance numbers compared with the first two months of 2023.

For February, total attendance was 7175 compared to 2023 attendance of 5956.

YTD: In the first two months of 2024, total attendance is 13,559 compared to 2023 YTD of 12,817

Missions Budget Stands at the following:

Beginning Balance at the end of January was \$320,402.32.

God's Goods brought in \$80,146.89 in Feb 2024 (Thanks be to God!)

Grants and distributions approved in February total \$40,974.00. Total

Funds on Hand as of the end of Feb. was \$359,575.21.

While all are impressive results, I strive to always remember that the true results are in the lives changed and needs met by the hard work of our Rector, Priests, wonderful staff, and volunteers. - Total Set Aside \$25,333.00 (See Appendix A below). This amount includes three mission trip funding requests. One request is from Drew Hamilton in the amount of \$1,600 for a mission trip to S. Korea. The next request is in the amount of \$550 from Emily Cook for a mission trip to the Dominican Republic. The final request is in the amount of \$1,650 from the Pratt family for a mission trip to the Dominican Republic. The amount also includes grant renewal for Harvesters International Ministries in the amount of \$3000 for 12 months and an additional \$2,100 in six installments, (6x\$350) ending in August.
- Total One Time Funding \$31,250
  - a. Anderson Sanchez, Peru, for repairs to the school's roof. \$8250.00
  - b. Christian Orphan Health, supplies for VBS in Eastern Europe. \$7000.00
  - c. AFM- \$20,000 in two installments (2x10,000), \$10,000 in March and \$10,000 in April to use for their three main funds.
- d. Amboseli Project Kenya-\$6,000 for school fees, boarding and day student for one year and school feeding program relief in the amount of \$2,000.

The Financial Board met and reviewed the requests on March 12, filed and approved a motion to recommend the Vestry approve the Requests.

Lee made a motion to approve, Joanne seconded, and all approved the motion.

#### V OTHER:

a. Thoughts on the Diocesan Convention (Michael and Craig)
Craig noted that the convention was organized and well received. There were great discussions about the new camp. Michael shared the characteristics of the new logo. There was also a discussion about the parishes who lost their properties and are moving forward in new locations.

b. Staff Changes (present and near future)

Michael-Anne Land is stepping down from the Childrens' Ministry as of June 1, 2024. She will continue with the American Heritage Girls and start a Ranger group for the boys.

We will be hiring a Curate, a new leader for the Childrens' Ministry and a second youth minister.

We are also searching for an Administrative Assistant.

- c. The Status of the project to remodel the Sunday School spaces to provide a cafeteria for us by the Cross Schools is on tract. However, 2024 Vacation Bible School has been canceled due to construction.
- d. The Church Leadership Workshop II on March 16 is ready to go. We discussed the purpose for the training and the importance of having leaders in the future.
- e. Joanne shared that coffee will be served at the chapel on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of each month.

## I: PRAYER AND DEVOTION: Craig Pelley

He felt his purposes had changed every 2 years and he knew God was leading him in different ministries. He is serving in Alpha this summer and he is excited to be part of this program. ## II MINUTES: Linda Laird

The Vestry Minutes for March 2024 were electronically distributed and were approved as written. The Vestry did not meet in April.

III: FINANCE: Lee Watkins, Treasurer's Report for Month Ending April 30, 2024:

Revenue Discussions: Revenue continues above budgeted numbers.

Regular monthly Income was at \$358,857.37 to a budget of \$295,860.00.

Plate Income for April was \$250,714.37 to a budget of \$227,735.00. Year

To Date Plate stands at: 1,106,458.09 to a budget of \$902,100.00.

For a YTD positive variance of \$204,358.09.

Total Revenue for the year is \$1,421,071.20 to a budget of \$1,174,600.00.

Also, two months in a row, Cross Counseling revenue was over budgeted revenue for April,

\$12,310.00 to a monthly budget of \$10,958.33. Great news!

Plate Income was expectedly lower in April than the previous Month of March because of Holy week and 5 Sundays in the month—but still, over budget.

March Plate: \$268,326.86 vs. April Plate: \$250,714.37

MTD Plate for May (first two weeks): \$98,787.20

MTD Plate Budget for May: \$104,412.80

**Expenses Discussion:** Expenses continue to be within expectations. Total expenses for the month were \$299,416.85 to a monthly budget of \$301,277.99. YTD Expenses are at

\$1,137,389.57 to a YTD budget of \$1,251,621.33. Expense variances of note were the charges for the HC Lighting and HC natural gas connection fee.

## **Church Attendance—March and April comparisons:**

## b. The Deacon and the Curate

## c. Status of the Chapel Columbarium project

Father Chuck shared the drawings of the proposed project. It follows the same plan as Cross School but on a smaller scale. There will be twenty identical classrooms so that flexibility in grade placement and activities can be achieved. There are large inner rooms for indoor activities when it rains. There is also a Worship Center/gym that can accommodate 450 people. The kitchen and nursing care are on the sides of the Worship Center. We are excited to begin this project, but it will not happen quickly. Permitting and approvals are slow to come.

## e. Construction details at Cross School

Father Chuck reviewed construction progress at the school. The current nursery will become a classroom for autistic students from Monday through Friday and a nursery during church services. There will be three additional classrooms and an office created on the second floor.

II MINUTES: Linda Laird

The Vestry Minutes for May 2024 were electronically distributed and corrected. Michael made the motion to approve the minutes, Wayne seconded the motion and all approved.

## III: FINANCE: Lee Watkins Treasurer's Report for Month Ending May 31, 2024:

Revenue Discussions: Monthly revenue continues to be slightly above budgeted numbers. Regular monthly Income was at \$338,402.59 to a budget of \$269,325.00. Plate Income for May was \$235,586.62 to a budget of \$201,200.00. Year To Date Plate stands at: 1,342,044.71 to a budget of 1,103,300.00. Total Revenue for the year is \$1,759,473.79 to a budget of \$1,443,925.00.

April Plate: \$250,714.37 vs. May Plate: \$235,586.62 MTD Plate for June (3 out of 5 Sundays): \$145,716.67

MTD Plate Budget for June: \$181,300.00

The tax refund (exemption) was received for the Argent property on the property taxes paid in March 2024. The total was 15,255.90.

Counseling Center revenue continues to be at budget for three months running.

God's Goods and staff continued their tremendous work with \$69,570.10 being added to the mission's budget. The current Missions Reserve Fund sits at \$348,269.84.

**Expenses Discussion:** Expenses continue to be within expectations.

Total expenses for the month were slightly down from April for an actual of \$291,940.71 to a monthly budget of \$305,677.99. Under budget by \$13,737.28

YTD Expenses are at \$1,429,330.28 to a YTD budget of \$1,557,229.32.

Expense variances of note were the charges for the HVAC repair to the counseling center \$1880 and expenses will continue to come in for the Apartment re-model at #3 Allen Street—which according to Roger is ahead of schedule and will be done by the deadline of July 1 (although he might not appreciate me quoting him on this)

Revenue (income) continues to pace ahead of expectations while our expenses are on track as we approach mid-year.

## Church Attendance—April and May comparatives:

May 2024 attendance increased over May 2023 by 351 attendees. April '24 to May '24 increase was 56 attendees. Attendance for the first session of Rooted (May 29) was 280. Cross School Graduation attendance was 250.

- 5. Anthony Pelloni, SAMS Cambodia: Grant Renewal approved for \$12,000 which is applied toward the ongoing expenses to serve in Cambodia.
- 6. Harvesters International Ministries: \$13,600 approved as follows: \$5,600 to replace the metal roof and complete the exterior brick for the church at Remera Rwanda and \$8,000 toward the completion of 4 classrooms at the Free Life Christian Academy which serves the orphans of the Free Life Children's Home in the DR Congo
- 7. Anglican Diocese of South Carolina: Approved \$20,000toward the Camp Jubilee Property Acquisition campaign.

Michael made a motion to approve the disbursements, Tom seconded and all agreed.

#### IV: OTHER:

- a. Historic Campus garage repurposing/renovation: The renovation is close to complete and should be ready for occupancy by July 1.
- b. Lisa Wilson is joining us as Administrative Associate. Lisa worked at God's Goods and the Island Packet. She will start work next week.
- c. Cross Schools activities: Wayne described what we can expect on the back 40. Progress is very slow. Scott Thomas is chair for campus development and busy with permits and deadlines. We wait, wait, and wait some more. We can look forward to seeing a cross country trail, concessions, baseball, and football fields, etc. Next year start times will be different for elementary and high school students due to difficulties with campus traffic. The renovation in the middle school is underway, increasing the number of classrooms and offices. The nurse remains on the ground floor but has moved from the pre-school side of Phase 1 to the K-1<sup>st</sup> side of Phase 1. The addition of a cafeteria, Church offices and classrooms is one project. The alleged donation will be applied to the total project. Wayne will be taking us on a tour of the school after the

meeting. Fr. Owens mentioned that we hope to have a classroom for students with autism. Wayne provided a tour of the area after our meeting.

d. Camp Jubilee: Bishop Edgar has shared his Camp Jubilee Property Acquisition campaign and challenged the diocese to support the fund raising efforts to purchase land for Camp Jubilee. He has asked TCOTC to donate \$100,000.00 in two years. The land is seventy acres, and 50 acres are buildable. After discussion the board suggested to send \$30,000 with the \$20,000 from the Mission Board this year and send \$50,000 next year.

Michael made a motion to send \$30,000 this year and \$50,000 next year. Tom seconded the motion and all agreed.

- e. Preschool on Argent: Father Owens described the schematic building plan for Argent East. It will look like Cross Schools on a smaller scale. The facilities will be sufficient and flexible in use for both preschool and worship.
- f. Wayne described the area of the playground near Shell Hall that is completed and being thoroughly enjoyed by our little tykes. This upgrade was made possible by a \$70,000.00 donation from the family of one of our young students whose father was killed in an unfortunate accident. The bench on the playground bears the father's name.
- g. Michael recently connected with Millard, Stew and Sally to catch up on their lives after Vestry. He also gave them a beautiful glass cross as a thank you for their service. He shared Judy's latest report and asked us to pray for them both during Judy's recovery.
- h. Request from St. Lukes Preschool director After revisiting the details of the request, the Vestry voted to approve the request.

## Treasurer's Report for Month Ending July 31, 2024:

Revenue Discussions: Monthly revenue finished over budget.

July monthly Income was at \$290,158.12 to a budget of \$295,960.00.



Plate Income for July was \$225,564.73 to a budget of \$207,835.00.

Year To Date Plate stands at: 1,830,315.39 to a budget of 1,492,435.00.

Total Revenue for the year is \$2,424,666.27 to a budget of \$1,969,310.00.

MTD Plate for August: \$100,340.56

MTD Plate Budget for August: \$241,000.00

Total Funds in the IntraFi account stands at 1,917,447.23. Interest from the IntraFi Account was \$4356.62. (this interest money along with a \$250.00 donation were moved over to the Jasper Co. Campus Fund)

God's Goods revenue for July was \$67,697.90 (Compared to June of \$69,570.10) being added to the mission's budget. The current Missions Reserve Fund sits at \$353,580.49.

**Expenses Discussion:** Monthly expenses were higher but continue to follow the yearly trend:

Total expenses for the month ranged from \$290,044.81 to a monthly budget of \$301,377.65. Under budget by \$11,332.84

YTD Expenses are at \$2,085,963.80 to a YTD budget of \$2,164,129.96.

Of note, the 3 Allen Street renovation appears to have come in well under budget at just over \$15,354.59.

Missions Funding is higher—however, this is offset by higher God's Goods Revenue. Ministry Expenses were higher in July but still within the yearly budget. These higher monthly expenses were related to the Alpha and Rooted Programs, Food for the Rooted Program, and higher Youth Expenses. There was also a \$10,426.00 Expense for Cross School Scholarships for an additional student—there is \$41,700.00/yr budgeted for the scholarship—this is the first draw taken for 2024.

Cross Counseling revenue came in under budget by \$3497.94, the YTD income variance is under by \$14,482.90.

Revenue and expenses continue a similar monthly trend.

## **Church Attendance for July:**

July 2024 attendance decreased over July 2023 by 772 attendees. The difference can be explained because there were only four Sundays in July 2024, but five Sundays in July 2023

#### 1. Diocesan 2023 Statistics:

## 3. Chapters 1-3 of The Rector and The Vestry and Part 1 of the ADOSC Vestry Handbook:

Fr. Owens led the Vestry in a study of the expectations of the Rector and the purpose of the Vestry. Vestry members thought it was exceptional reading, and they enjoyed the time for clarification and sharing their understanding. This study will continue next month.

## 4. Thoughts from Linda on recent God moments:

#### IV: OTHER:

a. Review of the 9/3/24 Leadership Gathering and the 2025 Budgeting Process:

Fr Owens lead us through the agenda presented at the Leadership Gathering. All were reminded that we are servants and are not to be served. The one who serves is more important. We serve the Lord and intensify our relationship with Him. At present, there are 40 staff leaders serving TCOTC, but our congregation is growing every year by an average of 300 families. Our need for more staff and more space will continue to be addressed. For now, all Staff will be responsible for identifying their ministry goals and expectations. Fr Owens shared the details of the Columbarium to be built at the Cross Point Campus. It will be a beautiful sanctuary with a live oak tree foundation, surrounded by fountains, seating areas, and an array of beautiful plants and flowers. All permits have been approved. Construction will take 60-90 days to complete. He also shared that there are many things planed for our area. There will be large developments springing up at the 195 and 278 intersections, both commercial and residential. Growth is moving in all directions. Residential housing will be developed off 170. Our development of the Argent campus could be especially important at this time. All permits have been approved and construction could start in the first quarter of 2025.

- b. 2025 Budgeting Process: As our congregation grows, we need more details from ministries seeking funding. Scheduling events becomes more difficult with more members but no added space. Rebecca and Nathan will receive these requests and compile a funding request. Regine will collaborate with them and collate program requests with salary information and 2025 income projections. In December, the Finance Committee meets to approve the proposed budget and sends it to the Vestry for approval.
- **c. Bishop Edgar's Visit:** The bishop will be coming to TCOTC on October 13. He will be preaching at the Chapel on the Buckwalter campus at 9 o'clock.
- d. Chapters 4-6 of The Rector and The Vestry and Part 2 of the ADOSC Vestry Handbook: The Vestry continued their study and discussion of the responsibilities of the Rector, the Wardens and the Vestry. All took part and clarifications were made. Conversations will continue next month.
- e. Other Comments: Wayne Bowerman shared that Cross Schools' renovations are almost completed. The cross country area will be ready for action soon. Craig Pelly shared a praise from Leah McCarthy for the Counseling Center.

**Revenue Discussions:** Monthly income finished over budget: September total monthly Income was at \$330,236.33 to a budget of \$284,805.00. Plate Income for September was \$235,500.23 to a budget of \$216,680.00.

A Reminder: The Historic Campus was closed for one weekend, impacting three services.

Year To Date Plate stands at \$2,347,546.54 to a budget of \$1,950,115.00.

Plate income variance is +\$397,431.54.

Total Income for the year is at \$3,097,049.98 to a budget of \$2,563,240.00.

(God's Goods revenue for September was \$53,086.83 (Compared to August of \$70,118.70) and has been added to the mission's budget. The current Missions Reserve Fund sits at \$369,620.02.

**Expenses Discussion:** Monthly expenses were higher than August (\$255,576.74)

Total expenses for the month were \$559,644.73 to a monthly budget of \$303,302.65. Over budget by \$256,342.08

The largest variance is from designating funds and moving \$265,000 to the Jasper County/Argent account.

There were some other variances as well, of note:

Missions Funding was over budget by \$29,916.33.

Cross School Scholarships expense of \$8868.00 was budgeted yearly but not monthly.

If we were to deduct the one-time expense of the transfer to the Jasper fund, then MTD expenses would be \$294,644.73—within budget.

YTD Expenses are at \$2,901,185.27 to a YTD budget of \$2,772,010.26—thru September--YTD expenses are still under budget by a total of \$129,175.01.

## **Church Attendance for September:**

Attendance in September was impacted by a widespread power outage that meant services for Saturday and Sunday Sept. 29<sup>th</sup> were not held at the Historic Campus. This impacted overall attendance by approximately four hundred.

## a. Update on Cross Schools: Wayne Bowerman

Cafeteria project: Work is currently on hold due to financial uncertainties. Enrollment is noticeably less than predicted. A motion is expected to be presented by the next B.O.T. meeting on October 22, whether to advance or not. Amended Development permit pending. Permit needed updating due to value engineering changes. For cafeteria project to be completed by start of '25/'26 school year, groundbreaking needs to occur by third week of November 2024. Cross Country trail: The Board is waiting for final approval from the Town. The Board will not initiate trail construction, even with permit in hand, until it has a clear understanding of land ownership and insurance recommendations and requirements. The access road was initiated by a parent volunteer in August.

\$24,233.00

The trail was fully marked in August, required additional town inspection, and has had initial inspection/approval from the town, waiting for final approval. This is due to the last-minute storm water/development issue.

Joe has secured a donor with a not-to-exceed donation that should cover the work. Two contractors bid on the trail work. Winning bidder is ready to begin once we have town approval.

Phase 4 (Middle School) second floor renovation is completed!

The "Back 40" Master Plan Amendment needs to be approved before any progress will be made. This has been a slow process. This may be a blessing in disguise; we need to obtain a clearer financial picture.

- **b.** Vestry Leadership Session Readiness: The Leadership training will be on Saturday, October26. All members of the Vestry are prepared and excited to meet the new team.
- c. Chapters 7-9 of The Rector and The Vestry and Part 3 of the ADOSC Vestry Handbook: The Vestry continued their study and discussion of the responsibilities of the Rector, the Wardens, and the Vestry. All took part in sharing what spoke to them or interested them. Fr. Owens made clarifications as needed. Conversations and study will continue next month.
