- 2. I've long taught that "we live life forward but understand it backward."
  - a. Have you found that statement to be true? Please explain why, using an example or two.
  - b. Senior citizens talk most about the past while young adults talk most about the future? Why do you think that's so?
- 3. One of life's fundamental questions is: "What are you living for?" Most adults these days say they're just marking time, waiting for something unknown to happen in the future. How would you answer that question?
- 4. Have life's bumps and bruises taken a toll on your faith? Please give examples of times when you thought God didn't care about you.
- 5. The Scriptures teach that God has a purpose for your life. (Jeremiah 29:11)

- a. What do think your God-ordained purpose is and why do you think that?
- b. Have you fulfilled your purpose? If not, please explain your strategy for doing so. If so, please revisit the question in #3 above.
- 6. True love always has a high price tag. How have you experienced this truth in your life?
- 7. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me will live, even though they die." (John 11:25)
  - a. Do you believe in Jesus as your Savior?
  - b. You may not know when you're going to die; but do you know how long you're going to live?
