- 1. Life comes at us quickly and rhythmically.
  - a. Time seems to move faster as we age. Have you found this to be true? If so, please give an example or two; if not, please share your secret.
  - b. What is your favorite season of the Church year and why?
- 2. Those in positions of authority in Jesus' time, lorded their power over others. Jesus taught that His disciples should turn that worldly example upside-down, seeking to serve rather than to be served. (Mark 10:42-43)
  - a. Can you site examples of leaders today who have embraced that mindset? If so, please do.
  - b. In this dog-eat-dog world, many consider serving others to be foolish. Do you? If not, please tell why and give a few examples from your life.
- 3. Many folks spend their entire adult lives searching for significance.
  - a. Are you one of them? If so, please share how you define significance and the efforts you've made to avoid insignificance.
  - b. Sometimes the folks who labor in the shadows have the greatest impact on our lives. Can you name someone like that in your life? Are you such a person in the life of others?
